Writing an Introductory Paragraph

- 1. **Hook the reader:** You can hook the reader in several ways. Choose one that works for you:
 - a. Opening with an unusual detail
 - b. Opening with a strong statement:
 - c. Opening with a Quotation:
 - d. Opening with a Statistic or Outrageous Fact
- 2. **Present key ideas of your essay** (to meet standards, you could simply rewrite your topic sentences).
- 3. **Thesis/Claim:** This is a sentence that sums up your position or argument.

Hook + **Key Ideas** + **Thesis Statement** = **Introductory Paragraph**

Writing a Concluding Paragraph

- 1. Restate your thesis (try to do this in different words)
- 2. Summarize your key points of your viewpoint. For meeting standards, this could be restating your topic sentences.
- 3. Call to action! This is where you leave the reader with an interesting final impression.

 *Do not introduce new information in the introduction.
